§ 92.02 Burning Trash.

(A) Burning trash within fire limits prohibited. No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, refuse, shavings, paper, leaves, litter, or other material of any kind outside any house, or on or in any street, sidewalk, alley, lot, or yard within the fire limits of the town.

(B) Burning trash outside fire limits. Trash or rubbish shall not be burned on any private lot outside the fire limits except with a county Burn Permit.

§ 92.03 Bonfire, Personal/Social Campfire: Permit Required.

(A) No person or Group shall kindle or maintain any bonfire, or shall knowingly furnish the material for any bonfire, or authorize any bonfire to be kindled or maintained, on or in any street, avenue, road, or lane, or public ground, or upon any private lot, within the limits of the town, unless a written permit so to do shall have first been secured from the Town of Littleton.

(B) Non profit groups such as a Veteran's Group, VFW, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, or Historical Society, etc and Groups approved to do so may have a Flag Retirement Ceremony that is a controlled burn. Notice to the town hall of date, time and approved location is needed before the ceremony and will be located on the Town Burn Permit which can be picked up at the Littleton Town Hall. Appropriate safety and fire control measures will be followed.

(C) A personal fire pit no larger than 4 feet by 4 feet may allow a controlled campfire with only natural materials burned. A permit must be obtained from the town hall. The fire pit will be behind the residence. Safety rules apply, such as, fire fighting equipment, active water hose connected to the house, buckets of sand or water, rakes/shovels or fire extinguishers must be present. No fires on windy days and no overhanging

tree limbs in the burn area. Barrier and raked area around the fire pit must be in place.

There will be no fires when the county has a county wide burn ban. Quiet hours will be enforced after 11 pm.

§ 92.04 Certain Fires to be Guarded.

All persons, firms, or corporations who shall burn any tar kiln or pit of charcoal, or set fire to or burn any brush, grass, or other material, whereby any property may be endangered or destroyed, shall keep and maintain a careful and competent watchperson in charge of that kiln, pit, brush, or other material while burning. Fire escaping from the kiln, pit, brush, or other material while burning shall be prima facie evidence of neglect of these provisions.
