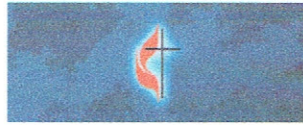

To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Littleton, NC.


Again, it has come to our attention that the Town of Littleton has received another request to permit an establishment named Sweepstakes Gaming Room "Lucky 7"; planned operation is from noon to 2:00 AM seven days a week. The so called entertainment is to consist of Sweepstakes computer gambling machines.

As communicated in June 2015 we are categorically against the town allowing an establishment of this nature to locate within the town's jurisdictional limits for these reasons.

1. Obviously, Lucky 7 is not an after school positive hangout, but a late night negative environment for our citizens. It is unlike the facility of "BB's Amusements" establishment located at 106 South East Main Street which is primarily a restoration and repair shop for arcade games.
2. We believe that this type of establishment tends to attract the lesser fortunate individuals who are already struggling financially and do not need to have this type of distraction while trying to provide for themselves or their families. As a church, we already see these families using our food pantry and as well as occasionally asking for monetary assistance.
3. We do not believe that this type of establishment will enhance the town's image nor improve the quality of the lives of the Littleton's residents and could be a deterrent to future economic development.
4. The Littleton Police Department which frequently operates with a skeletal staff will have limited ability to oversee the overall security of the town based on the proposed operating hours of the establishment thus creating the possibility of increased crime, loitering, and creating the perception of an unsafe environment for our town's residents.
5. Regardless of the petitioner's business plan to utilize the Town of Littleton's public parking area, it is located at the far end of the business block. Human nature being what it is, we feel that patrons would park in our private church parking lot which is directly across the street from the proposed establishment. This would create problems and concerns for our property being used in this manner and for the patrons of our church during those operating hours.

Thanks you for allowing us to present this letter of opposition to you. We will be glad to discuss our position with the board on May 1<sup>st</sup> at 6:30.


