Water Shortage Response Plan Town of Littleton, North Carolina July 10, 2018



The procedures herein are written to reduce potable water demand and supplement existing drinking water supplies whenever existing water supply sources are inadequate to meet current demands for potable water.

I. Authorization

The Town of Littleton shall enact the following water shortage response provisions whenever the trigger conditions outlined in Section IV are met. In his or her absence, the Public Utilities Supervisor will assume this role.

II. Notification

The following notification methods will be used to inform water system employees and customers of a water shortage declaration: employee e-mail announcements, notices at municipal buildings, notices in water bills. Required water shortage response measures will be communicated through *The Roanoke Rapids Daily Herald* and the town's website http://www.townoflittleton-nc.us. Declaration of emergency water restrictions or water rationing will be communicated to all customers by telephone through use of reverse 911.

III. Levels of Response

Five levels of water shortage response are outlined in the table below. The five levels of water shortage response are: voluntary reductions, mandatory reductions I and II, emergency reductions and water rationing. A detailed description of each response level and corresponding water reduction measures follow below.

The goal of Stage 5, Water Rationing, is to provide drinking water to protect public health (e.g. residences, residential health care facilities and correctional facilities). In Stage 5, all customers are only permitted to use water at the minimum required for public health protection. Firefighting is the only allowable outdoor water use and pickup locations for distributing potable water will be announced according to Littleton's Emergency Response Plan. Drought surcharges increase to 5 times the normal water rate.

IV. Triggers

The Town of Littleton is provided water solely by purchase from the Halifax County. When Halifax County declares a water shortage the Town of Littleton is required to do so as well. During this time Littleton Utilities Supervisor will stay in close contact with Halifax County and follow their triggers.

Return to Normal

When water shortage conditions have abated and the situation is returning to normal, water conservation measures employed during each phase should be decreased in reverse order of implementation. Permanent measures directed toward long-term monitoring and conservation should be implemented or continued so that the community will be in a better position to prevent shortages and respond to recurring water shortage conditions.

V Enforcement

The provisions of the water shortage response plan will be enforced by Town of Littleton utility department and police personnel. Violators may be reported to the Town's dedicated water conservation hotline, town hall. Citations are assessed according to the following schedule depending on the number of prior violations and current level of water shortage.

Drought surcharge rates are effective in Stages 3, 4 and 5.
