

The Board of Commissioners held a work session Monday, June 10, 2013, at the Town Hall. The purpose of the meeting was to consider budget amendments and retroactive holiday comp time off. Commissioners present were Heidi Hogan, Clara Debnam and Jimmy Kearney.

Mayor Bobbitt called the meeting to order at 4:30 pm.

The Board discussed the police department's budget and the proposed budget amendments to allow for more part-time. Also discussed were amendments to the water department budget to compensate for extra time Assistant Clerk Carver was having to work on the new software system. Commissioner Kearney also stated he was going to use what was left in his budget for gravel in the cemetery. Commissioner Kearney made a motion seconded by Commissioner Debnam, to approve the following budget amendments;

The motion was voted and carried.

The Board discussed problems with drainage pipes on Moore and College Streets and Mayor Bobbitt advised she would check for any more drainage problems.

The Board discussed giving Chief Suggs additional comp time off for working holidays. The discussion included Chief Suggs should have asked in advance (for holiday comp time off), he should have scheduled part time to cover the holidays as he was the one doing the scheduling, he would get an additional 80 hours for the holidays if approved, and the comp time off needed to be used and not accrued. Commissioner Kearney made a motion seconded by Commissioner Debnam, to give Chief Suggs the additional 80 hours, making the total 413 hours of comp time off (hour for hour), he would be required to take 4 hours off each week and not schedule someone else to cover the time off, he could not accrue any more comp time off and the 413 hours had to be used completely within 12 months. The motion was voted and carried.

The Board discussed several properties that would be presented to the KIPP board at their meeting June 19<sup>th</sup> as possible locations for a new school.

Commissioner Kearney made a motion seconded by Commissioner Hogan, to adjourn the meeting at 5:20 pm. The motion was voted and carried.
