

The Littleton Board of Commissioners held a work session Tuesday, July 16, 2013, at 3:00 pm, at the Town Hall. Commissioners present were Terry Newsom, Heidi Hogan and Jimmy Kearney. The purpose of the meeting was to consider applicants for part time work, comp time, and any other business brought before the Board.

Mayor Bobbitt called the meeting to order and the Commissioner Newsom reported on the Merchant's Association meeting. Discussion followed.

Mayor Bobbitt reported she had a request from Leslie Riley to put signs up in Littleton for Rails to Trails. Commissioner Hogan made a motion seconded by Commissioner Kearney, to approve the request. The motion was voted and carried.

Mayor Bobbitt relayed and invitation to the board for a dedication and ribbon cutting ceremony for Lee's Chapel Missionary Baptist Church, for Saturday, August 27, at 10:00 am.

Following the finance officer explaining the invoices had been outstanding since April and May, and would be reimbursed by the Rural Center North Side Grant, Commissioner Newsom made a motion seconded by Commissioner Kearney, to pay the Ferguson Enterprise invoices in the amount of \$17,821.65. The motion was voted and carried.

Following discussion, Commissioner Newsom made a motion seconded by Commissioner Kearney, to hire Clayton Fogg and Kevin Dawson, as part time employees for Streets and Water and Sewer at \$8.33/hour, to work as needed. The motion was voted and carried.

Mayor Bobbitt stated she had thought the comp time for Mike Suggs had been settled, that it was a package deal. He would get the comp time hours and would take the hours in the manner stated by the Board. Discussion followed including the original hours to use each week had been miscalculated and changing it to at least 8 hours and up to 12 hours each week. No action was taken and the matter was tabled until the next work session so the Town Attorney could be consulted.

The Board discussed some of the requirements from KIPP regarding a Request for Proposal for locating a school. The request didn't look feasible for the Town to submit anything, especially with the time limitation; proposals had to be submitted in about two weeks.

The Board discussed the new schedule for solid waste and recycling collections for the County's new contract and Asplundh was cutting the power company's right of ways in Town.
